

# Mandatory Water-Use Restrictions



Water-use restrictions became California state law in 2017, making water efficiency a way of life.

CVWD enforces these restrictions and fines could be imposed.



Do not water outdoor landscaping during or within 48 hours after measurable rainfall.



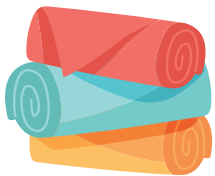
Use a hose with a shut-off nozzle when washing your vehicle, windows or solar panels.



Repair broken sprinklers within 24 hours of notification.



Do not apply water to any hard surface including, but not limited to, driveways, sidewalks, and asphalt.



Hotels and motels must provide guests with the option of choosing not to have towels and linens laundered daily.



Homeowners' associations or community service organizations cannot block, stifle, or threaten homeowners from reducing or eliminating the watering of vegetation or lawns during a declared drought emergency.



Fix or adjust irrigation systems that cause water runoff. Do not apply water to outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes runoff to adjacent property, roadways, parking lots, etc.



Do not water ornamental turf on public street medians.



Restaurants may only serve water upon request. Order table tents for your restaurant.



Do not use potable water in a fountain or other decorative water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system.
